THE BLACK POINT GOLF OUTING IS BACK!!


After a brief hiatus, we are happy to announce that we will once again host

- The following areas have been designated as approved swimming areas. (a) the Main Beach located between Nehantic Drive and Sea Breeze Avenue (up to the large boulder) within the swimming markers;
 (b) the South Beach located on the south side of the pier located at the end of Osprey Road within the swimming markers.
- **4.)** All swimming is at one's own risk, as the Association employs no swimming lifeguards.
- 3.) No diving or jumping from any piers at any time!
- **4.)** Ball playing or "Frisbee" throwing in the approved swimming areas and their beaches is prohibited.
